This type of critical thinking involves asking fundamental questions concerning the ideas, beliefs and attitudes that you will encounter.

Being critical does not just mean finding fault. It means assessing evidence from a variety of sources and making reasoned conclusions.

Critical thinking is about using your ability to reason. It's about being active in your learning and questioning ideas, arguments and findings. In an academic argument ideas are organised into a line of reasoning. The writer aims to persuade the reader that their point of view is valid. Being able to understand and create structured, reasoned arguments is central to critical thinking.

Critical thinking is necessary to education, and writing is an essential way to develop critical thinking skills. When writing, you draw from what you already know, seek relevant information about a main idea, and develop new concepts regarding that idea. That is critical thinking at its best. Knowledge and learning are not possible without critical thinking and writing is the best way to develop a mind that thinks critically.
